

### President's Message

Dear Alumni Community,

Some months back a tweet from the United States Secretary of State Anthony Blinken caught my eye. Secretary Blinken tweeted: "Studying abroad as a teenager helped me to see my own country through others' eyes - a perspective I carry to this day. International Education is a crucial part of our diplomacy and national security. It is also a transformational experience."

This is a perspective that will resonate with many Woodstock alumni, whether they are alumni from North America who had the privilege of studying at Woodstock, or alumni from India who went on to college in North America. Over the past decade, more than half of the graduating seniors from Woodstock have gone on for college in North America. A great many have stayed on to build careers, providing renewable energy to the FWS North America alumni community.

In May 2023 I attended the graduation ceremony of Woodstock's Class of 2023. I was struck by how confident and well prepared these students seemed to be. Woodstock continues to turn out batch after batch of remarkable young global citizens, ready to thrive in whatever corner of the world they land.

This was the first time I had been to a graduation ceremony at Woodstock since my own in 1973, 50 years ago. My graduation, from a class of about 45 seniors, was held in Parker Hall. The 2023 ceremony, for a class of about 90 seniors, was held in the larger Mumby Gym. Mumby Gym today is a terrific venue for sporting events and large assemblies of the school community. It was renovated over a decade ago with assistance from FWS.

FWS continues to provide significant assistance to Woodstock. Over the past 5 years FWS has helped Woodstock (i) construct the new Centre For Imagination, which was built on the old Tafton site, (ii) remodel dozens of classrooms, and (iii) completely renovate and update Woodstock's science labs. If you go back to visit, you will be amazed at the upgrades to the campus infrastructure.

However, one central part of the high school that has been crying out for attention and renovation is Parker Hall. Parker Hall hasn't changed in 50 years. Woodstock now has detailed plans to renovate this hallowed space over the next 3-5 years, but the timing to complete this project will be subject to financial support from classes, individual alumni, and FWS.

Based on goals and priorities articulated by Woodstock, and feedback received from our North America alumni community, we expect support from FWS to Woodstock to be focused on three primary areas during the next 3-5 years: (i) the renovation of Parker Hall, (ii) providing scholarship aid for current students, and (iii) helping Woodstock build its scholarship endowment fund for the future.

FWS will work with Woodstock on these priorities, but we want you to know that none of the grants we make to Woodstock would be possible without your interest, commitment, and generous support. If you would like to know more about any of these key areas of focus, please contact David or Connie Wheeler at our Freeland, WA office or reach out to any of the FWS Board members. We would be glad to speak with you about any of these programs and projects.

David and Connie Wheeler and those of us on the FWS Board look forward to catching up with many of you at our next FWS / WOSA Reunion, which we are planning to hold in person in Tempe, Arizona over a 3-day weekend from October 27th -30th, 2023. This will be our first inperson reunion since our gathering in Tampa, Florida in January 2020. We are excited to get together again after a three-year pause!

As always, the FWS Board thanks you for your past and continuing support, and would like to hear your ideas and suggestions of ways in which you would like to help us grow as an organization. FWS is committed to serving its members and supporting the school's strategic goals. Have a great year in 2023-2024, and know that Woodstock keeps churning out amazing alumni that are just as unique and interesting as you!

### FRIENDS OF WOODSTOCK SCHOOL | GRANTS TO WOODSTOCK

The FWS Board of Directors reviews and approves all grants made from its designated and undesignated funds.

Grants made in FY 2021-2022 total \$1,202,312 consisting of:

### **Designated Grants**

### **Woodstock School Science Wing | \$1,000,000**

To fund the renovation of the Woodstock School Science Wing.

### Woodstock School Classroom Renovations | \$29,316

To fund the renovation of High School and Quad classrooms to ensure they are comfortable, insulated, ergonomic and multi-functional. In other words, "from wall to wall and from ceiling to floor and everything in between." With the support of so many and matching funds from Friends of Woodstock School, the following classroom was renovated:

• QS 34 in honor of Woodstock's Unsung Heroes: custodians, janitors, cooks and many others.



### Hanifl Centre Grant | \$15,000





The worst of COVID is now behind us for which we are all grateful. But last year at this time things were only just starting to look hopeful. However, there is no question that COVID impacted all of us financially and it most certainly impacted the market. As of now the market has not fully recovered to its previous level but it appears to be on its way to recovery. This impacts FWS since we have something over \$5 million dollars in the market. In spite of all of this, we had a stellar year. YOU - alumni, staff and friends - donated \$727.524 to FWS.

Combining your gifts with funds earned in the market, Woodstock received just over a million dollars in grants from FWS in this fiscal year. The bulk of this went to the renovation of the Science wing while also, in part, funding several classroom renovations, helping fund a new Internship Program at the Hanifl Center, as well as funding for the Artist Residency Program at the Centre for Imagination. Further, your gifts helped the Woodstock Employees Children's Education Fund. In the area of scholarships, grants of \$60,199 were made for students who would otherwise not be able to attend Woodstock and an additional \$62,084 were made to Woodstock graduates attending universities in North America.

Where does all this money come from? From several sources.


One source of income that I have mentioned already is YOU, while the second source of income is what we make (most of the time!) in the market with help and oversight of Alliance Bernstein. The \$5 million we have in the market consists of \$1 million in the FWS Legacy Endowment Fund, \$2 million in Undesignated Funds and \$2 million in our named Scholarship Endowment Funds. Net investment income is used, in part, to fund scholarships from our 10 named Scholarship Funds, fund grants to Woodstock School and Kaplani School, and to cover administrative, program and fundraising expenses. As you might imagine someone needs to track everything that comes in and everything that goes out. And that person is David Wheeler who has been doing this for more than 20 years now. The FWS Finance Committee is composed of Steve Van Rooy, David Shastry, David Wheeler, Amit Lalvani, and Jonlyn Freeman. Bruce Davis, FWS President, who, although not technically a member, is always invited and welcome to join our meetings. One thing the Finance Committee does is to keep an eye on our investments. We also process all grant and scholarship applications and pass them on with our recommendation to the Board. We meet three to four times a year, often several weeks before the FWS Board meetings. We as a committee are indebted to David Wheeler for the meticulous way he keeps the books and I am indebted to the time and talent of the members of the Finance Committee.

I continue to be shocked and awed by the generosity of the FWS community. Lots of successful companies tout their "secret ingredient." FWS has a not-so-secret ingredient. YOU.
