President's Message

Dear Alumni Community,

We are an approximately 3,000-strong community of Woodstock alumni, staff, parents and friends bound together by our experience of being nurtured on the Landour hillside. Thanks to the support and commitment of this community, FWS has been able to provide significant financial, administrative and alumni engagement support to Woodstock for over a generation.

Over the past decade we have watched Woodstock thrive and be recognized as one of the leading international schools in Asia. Over the past two years this momentum was stalled by the COVID pandemic, but as I write this message in the spring of 2022 I am happy to report that Woodstock survived the COVID disruptions and students are back in full force on campus. Craig Cook, Woodstock's Principal, has done a good job managing the pandemic challenges, and I believe Woodstock has a strong academic and administrative leadership team in place to lead the school forward.

In my message this year I would like to call your attention to how Woodstock was able to make lemonade out of lemons during the peak of the pandemic. During the months when the school was closed and students were involved in distance learning, Woodstock pushed forward renovating classrooms and building a completely renovated and state-ofthe-art science wing in the High School. Because of COVID, the school had that rare opportunity to do a quality renovation of science labs and classrooms without massive disruption to teachers and students. As many of you know, this was TZ's dream come true: to have first-rate science facilities and a good science faculty located within the heart of the High School. Woodstock could never have done this with all students packed in on campus.

The alumni community and FWS came to Woodstock's support in a big way over the past two years. We made grants of over \$1.8 million during this period. The biggest chunk of this support was to renovate the science labs, with a pledge of funding of \$500,000 from Rick Downs, Class of '79 toward this project and FWS matching Rick's gift. The Woodstock staff and students are very grateful to Rick for his support, as is the alumni community here in North America.

We anticipate an active period of grant support over the next couple of years in five key areas: renovation of Quad music facilities, scholarships, advanced certification and professional development for teachers, community engagement, including support for the Kaplani School, and a major renovation of Parker Hall in the High School. None of these grants would be possible without your interest, commitment and generous support. If you would like to know more about any of these key areas of support, please contact David or Connie Wheeler at our Freeland, WA office or reach out to any of the FWS Board members. We would be glad to speak with you about any of these programs and projects.

David and Connie Wheeler and those of us on the FWS Board look forward to catching up with many of you on Zoom calls over the next few months and at our next FWS / WOSA Reunion, which we are planning to hold virtually over a 3-day weekend from July 29th -31st, 2022. We had hoped the 2022 reunion would be an in-person gathering, but COVID uncertainties last fall made this unrealistic. But stay tuned. We are currently planning an in-person reunion for 2023 to be held in the Phoenix area.

As always, the FWS Board thanks you for your past and continuing support, and would like to hear your ideas and suggestions of ways in which you would like to help us grow as an organization. FWS is committed to serving its members and supporting the school's strategic goals, particularly in challenging times like these.





TREASURER'S REPORT



Friends of Woodstock School is a foundation. We raise money from our exceptional Woodstock donor base, invest it, and grant funds to Woodstock School for various projects and purposes. That is what we do. This may sound simple enough, but it does get a bit more complex than it might seem.

As you might guess when you are dealing with money coming in and money going out, there is a significant amount of accounting that happens. Most of this is done by David Wheeler in the FWS office on Whidbey Island, Washington. Once a year we have a CPA firm do a review to make sure all is in order (a review is not the same as an "audit" but it is about 80% of an audit).

And then there is fiduciary oversight of what we have in the market. We take this task seriously. There are five people on our Finance Committee: David Wheeler, David Shastry, Amit Lalvani, Jonlyn Freeman and me. Several of these, Amit and Jonlyn in particular, are highly qualified in the field of finance. Further, Alliance Bernstein, with whom we have worked now for 12 years, has been a good partner to give advice and expertise (and they are well known for their work with foundations).

So our income as a foundation comes from donations from alumni, parents, staff and friends from what we earn on what we have in the market. Our "return" in the market over the past 12 years has been over 7%, net of fees. And since foundations are typically rather conservative this has been a very good return. So besides accounting and besides income (from donors and what we gain in the market), the third thing FWS does is vet and fund grant proposals from Woodstock. All of these proposals come through the Finance Committee. We look at each one and then pass these along with a recommendation (for or against) to the Board of FWS.

So how did we do in the fiscal year 2020 - 2021?

By way of income, we had a \$1,249,316 return on investments (a very good year indeed with a total of \$6,482,301 of assets in the market). We also had \$223,815 in donations. So our total net income for the fiscal year was \$1,473,131.

By way of outflow we granted Woodstock a total of \$680,775. \$116,579 was awarded for Li-chiang Chu Scholarships and Endowed Scholarships. See the annual report's Grants page for individual details.

One last word. NONE of this is possible without YOU. You, as a Woodstock wallah, help make Woodstock one of the shining lights in the world of international schools. FWS loves and supports this school which impacted us and helped make us who we are today.
